

EDUCATIVE PROJECT

The Museu Olímpic i de l'Esport Joan Antoni Samaranch, managed by the Fundació Barcelona Olímpica, is a window open to the world of sports.

Our educative project is based on participatory methodologies in which we work from dialogue, discovery, play and reflection to offer a significant learning experience that connects the theme of the museum with the interests and reality of the students.

Currently, the educational program is guided by the Sustainable Development Goals (Agenda 2030).

Thanks to the proximity of the Olympic Ring, we can offer activities related to the heritage left by the different events that took place on the Montjuïc mountain.

The objectives pursued by the program are:

- Disseminate and promote that sport is essential and beneficial in all facets of life.
- Promote values of respect, cooperation, collaboration and empathy with respect to others.
- Encourage reflection and critical thinking.

Below you can see the program of activities differentiated by educational stages, from the second cycle of early childhood education to university and in different formats: dynamic, guided visits or workshops. These can be carried out in the educational center or in the museum.

As a **novelty**, we propose a new workshop, called <u>No Borders</u>, focused from the second cycle of early childhood education to the middle cycle of primary school. Children will be able to discover traditional games from different cultures and come to the conclusion that everyone is equal.

SELF-GUIDED MUSEUM VISIT




DISCOVER COBI'S FRIENDS

This is an interactive tour with an educator of the museum. First, every pupil will have to paint its own identification card with the mascot of the Barcelona'92 Olympic Games, Cobi. After that, a guided tour of the visit will be carried out, where they will look for Cobi's Friends, a Group of mascots of different sport events that will help explaining the most relevant moments and elements of the sports practice in an international level

INTRODUCTORY SESSION TO THE OLYMPIC MOVEMENT

The Introductory session to the Olympic Movement is an activity carried out by an educator of the museum. It is a theoretical and participative explanation with audiovisual support, in the museum's auditorium, about the origins and evolution of the Olympic Games. Once finished, the group will be able to visit the museum On their own.

- 1. Discover the wide range of sporting events that exist and the groups to which they are aimed.
- 2. Understand the term disability through images of people with disabilities practicing sports.
- 3. Acquire guidelines for behaviour, observation and enjoyment in a museum.
- 4. Identify key moments in the history of Olympism

NO LIMITS

A workshop activity consisting of a theoretical part, in which participants will learn about different types of disabilities and see some of the sporting events that exist for disabled people; and a practical part where participants will play a sport featured in the Paralympic program: boccia, goalball or sitting volleyball.

After the workshop, participants can take a self-guided tour of the museum.

Objectives

- 1. Sensitize schoolchildren in the normalization of groups with disabilities.
- 2. Give resources to students to develop attitudes of empathy towards people with disabilities.
- 3. Experiment and reflect on the limitations of people with disabilities.
- 4. Foster cooperative and collaborative values with classmates.
- 5. Know the sporting events focused on these groups...
- 6. Reject discriminatory behaviours.
- 7. Raise awareness about sport as a tool for inclusion.

NO GENDER

Workshop with Hall Escape methodology in which the students will discover real cases of athletes with gender diversity and their fight for normalization in the sports world.

In this workshop, they will be asked to think critically in order to reflect on the reality of sport.

After the workshop, participants can take a self-guided tour of the museum.

Objectives:

- 1. Know and reflect on the reality of gender.
- 2. Identify, treat and become aware of gender diversity in sport, which can be extrapolated to any other field.
- 3. Know the reality of participation in the Olympic Games.
- 4. Become aware of sport as a tool for inclusion.
- 5. Know the appropriate specific terminology for gender diversity.
- 6. Have a respectful attitude towards diversity, understanding it as wealth.
- 7. Learn to listen to others, to take into account their opinions and to respect differences.

DISCOVERING BARCELONA'92

Workshop divided into two parts: in the first, they will discover different elements that were used for the Barcelona Games (Olympic and Paralympic mascot, emblems, ceremonies, volunteering, etc.) and they will learn how the city changed to host the Games. In the second, depending on the educational level, they will have to create a poster or mascot of a Games based on what they have discovered and on given parameters. This activity is carried out through discovery, cooperation, play and critical thinking. Once the workshop is over, the group can freely access the museum.

Objectives:

- 1. Know and reflect on the change that Barcelona experienced.
- 2. Raise awareness about sport as a tool for inclusion
- 3. Know the elements that have been designed to organize some Games
- 4. Foster cooperative and collaborative values with classmates.
- 5. Experiment and reflect on the values of sport and the Olympic Games

Objectives:


- 1. Discover the transversality of sport in relation to the Sustainable Development Goals, without identifying each feature with an Objective.

- 4. Recover and publicize traditional games, discovering other realities, cultures and traditions, and dealing with interculturality through play.
- 5. Develop attitudes of understanding, respect and appreciation regarding other cultures, favoring the values of tolerance, solidarity, non-discrimination, among others.
- 6. Respect classmates and companions in activities.


Both students and teachers will receive a series of materials and documents to allow them to carry out the composite work, which is adapted for the educational level of the first or second stages of secondary school.









GUIDED TOUR OF THE OLYMPIC STADIUM
