We have **reviewed and updated** the activities to respond to **current educational challenges**, with an open, critical perspective that is connected to today's world.

We continue to enhance **accessibility** and have introduced **Catalan Sign Language (LSC)**, with interpreter support available across the different languages we offer.

We have adjusted participation ratios to ensure a **high-quality, attentive and inclusive** learning experience for all students.

A **smoother booking process**, with the option to manage reservations online, making it easier to plan educational and cultural outings.

We have streamlined and reorganised the educational programme to make it clearer and easier to navigate, grouping all activities into **three main categories** designed to reflect different ways of engaging with the Olympic and Sports Museum:

**Discovery and awareness Workshops** that explore values and a range of topics through hands-on experiences at the museum and active participation.

**Museum and surroundings**  
Activities both inside **the museum and in its surroundings** to explore its history, heritage and broader context.

**Visit us**  
Different **ways to visit the museum**: self-guided visits, guided tours, and optional self-led activities.



# THE EDUCATIONAL PROJECT

The **values of sport** are at the heart of the educational activities at the Joan Antoni Samaranch Olympic and Sports Museum, run by the Barcelona Olympic Foundation.

The museum is a window onto the history of Olympism and sport, rooted in the context of our city. Through the museum experience and its range of activities, we aim **to connect this heritage with students' realities and interests.**

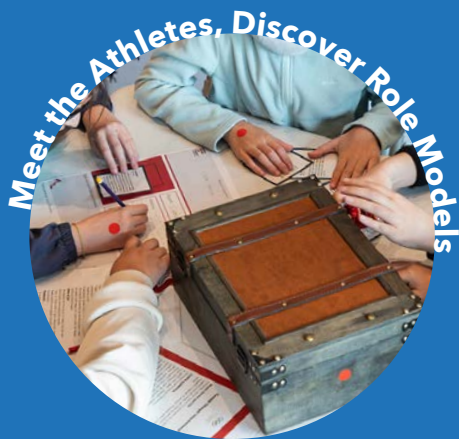
Our educational project is built on the belief that **sport is a powerful educational tool.** We work through dialogue, discovery, play and reflection, creating meaningful experiences that link the museum's content to today's key challenges.

The activities encourage children and young people to ask questions and **develop a critical perspective** in a world full of challenges, where promoting values such as respect, cooperation, commitment, participation and collaboration is more important than ever. These are the values embodied by Olympism and sport.

With this approach, we aim to foster reflection and critical thinking, while strengthening key competences such as communication, global awareness, social and civic engagement, and autonomy.



# NEW FOR THE 2026–2027 SCHOOL YEAR



We have updated the activity that explores **gender and sexual diversity** through the lens of **sport**. Under its new title, ***Meet the Athletes, Discover Role Models***, the focus shifts to highlighting diverse sporting role models and encouraging reflection on values such as **equality, respect and inclusion**. The activity retains its hall escape format and now includes a **follow-up element for the classroom**: at the end of the workshop, participants receive a poster featuring key role models and ideas explored, designed to continue sparking discussion and reflection back at school.

This long-standing activity has been updated with a **new storytelling element**. Under the title ***Cobi's Crew***, it highlights the group of characters who accompany students throughout their visit.

The activity takes the form of a ***guided, interactive visit led by the education team***, where children explore the museum spaces alongside Cobi—the mascot of the Barcelona 1992 Olympic Games—and other mascots they discover along the way.



This school year, we are launching a **new activity** that invites students to **discover the museum in an active and participatory way**. By searching for balls throughout the permanent exhibition, students will explore how this everyday object changes across different sports. They will compare shapes, materials and uses, and also reflect on adapted sports.

To conclude, students will work in groups to design a new ball tailored to a challenge, a specific group, or a new game. A creative proposal that encourages them to see sport from a fresh perspective.

# COBI'S CREW

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC

Ages 3 to 6

75€/group

1h

This activity is built around a story featuring **Cobi**, the mascot of the Barcelona '92 Olympic Games. As the story unfolds, students explore the different areas of the museum while encountering other **mascots from major sporting events**. These characters guide them through the exhibition, helping them discover a range of sports and understand the meaning and values of the Olympic Games.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Foster learning through play, storytelling and direct experience.
- Support children's emotional, social and cultural development.
- Present the museum as an accessible, welcoming and meaningful space from an early age.

# EXPLORE WITHOUT LIMITS

2h

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC

Ages 5 to 16

140€/group

In this activity, students will learn about **adapted sport** and its main competitions.

An introductory explanation will encourage reflection on **inclusion and diversity** in sport. This is followed by a hands-on experience, where participants try out a Paralympic discipline (such as **boccia, goalball or sitting volleyball**), combining theory and practice to create a meaningful, experiential learning experience.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Raise awareness about disability through direct experience.
- Promote values-based education grounded in inclusion, respect and coexistence.
- Understand sport as a tool for participation, personal growth and equal opportunities.

# PLAYING WITHOUT BORDERS

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC

Ages 6 to 10

140€/group

1h30'

What games did our grandparents play? And what do children play in other parts of the world?

In this workshop, students will travel across the **continents represented at the Olympic Games**, discovering traditional games from different cultures. They will explore and share **ways of playing from around the world**, learning about diverse forms of play while fostering **curiosity** about other cultures and **respect** for cultural diversity.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Foster cultural awareness and expression through global cultural heritage.
- Encourage respect for cultural and generational diversity.
- Promote dialogue, shared play and active participation.

# ONE OBJECT, MANY GAMES

Ages 8 to 12

1h30'

This is a participatory activity that invites students to **discover the museum** through a familiar object: the ball. By observing, comparing and drawing, they will **reflect** on different sports, adapted sports and the diversity of people's needs. The activity begins with an exploratory phase in the museum and culminates in a **creative group task**, where students design a new ball tailored to a specific sporting or social challenge, or even a game of their own invention.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Encourage an active, critical and inclusive perspective on sport through a familiar object.
- Promote observation, reflection, creativity and collaborative work.
- Experience the museum as a space for discovery, thinking and participation.

# MEET THE ATHLETES, DISCOVER ROLE MODELS

CAT ENG LSC

Ages 12 to 18

140€/group

2h

The workshop takes the form of a *hall escape*, where participants solve a series of challenges to uncover five different athletes.

Each athlete's story brings forward different perspectives, exploring **gender and sexual diversity** through the lens of **sport**, and highlighting both discrimination and resilience within the sporting world.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Encourage a respectful perspective on gender and sexual diversity.
- Introduce role models and promote inclusive, discrimination-free sport.
- Foster dialogue, equality, respect, inclusion and critical thinking.

# ONE STADIUM, A HUNDRED STORIES

1h

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC

Ages 3 to 6

75€/group

The aim of this activity is to help students discover what a stadium is and learn about different sports, guided by Cobi and Petra, the mascots of the Barcelona '92 Olympic Games.

\* The activity takes place in the surroundings of the Stadium and the Olympic Ring; the Stadium itself is not visited.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Spark children's curiosity through exploring the history of the stadium.
- Support meaningful learning through play.
- Identify different sports with the help of characters.

# A STADIUM FOR HISTORY

1h

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC

Ages 6 to 16

75€/group

The aim of this activity is for students to explore the history of the stadium and the wide range of sporting events it has hosted, through discovery, cooperation and play.

\* The activity takes place in the surroundings of the Stadium and the Olympic Ring; the Stadium itself is not visited.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Develop cultural and historical awareness through an iconic space of sporting heritage.
- Encourage active participation, cooperation and learning through discovery.

# INTRODUCTION TO OLYMPISM

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC

Ages 6 to 18

Up to 60 ppl.

1h

An activity designed to explore the **origins and evolution of the Olympic Games**. It takes place in the museum auditorium, where the education team delivers a participatory session **supported by audiovisual materials**.

An ideal option for larger groups who wish to take part in a shared activity.

- Develop active listening, participation and content understanding.
- Encourage an independent and reflective view of the museum as a space for knowledge and learning.

# DISCOVERING BARCELONA '92

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC

Ages 8 to 16

140€/group

2h

In this activity, students work in small groups to **explore** different aspects of the Barcelona '92 Olympic and Paralympic Games through the **museum exhibition**, including mascots, symbols, ceremonies and the role of volunteers.

**Each group focuses on a specific topic and, at the end, shares its findings with the rest of the class, bringing together the different aspects explored.**



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Recognise and value cultural and symbolic expressions as part of historical heritage.
- Actively participate in group work, taking responsibility for researching and sharing information, while developing communication, listening and summarising skills.

# GUIDED TOUR OF THE OLYMPIC RING

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC

Ages 12 to 18

140€/group

1h30'

A route through the Olympic Ring that takes students back to Olympic Barcelona, exploring **iconic sites and key buildings** that shaped the **city's transformation** for the 1992 Olympic Games.

An opportunity to rediscover Barcelona through its **sporting, architectural and historical legacy**. The route includes the Olympic Stadium, Palau Sant Jordi, the Bernat Picornell swimming pools, the telecommunications tower and surrounding sculptures, while reflecting on the role of major events—especially the 1992 Olympic Games—as catalysts for urban transformation.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Analyse urban transformation and link historical events to changes in the city's landscape, infrastructure and organisation.
- Recognise and interpret the heritage, architectural and symbolic value of these spaces.

# GUIDED VISIT TO THE MUSEUM

1h

CAT CAST ENG FRA LSC All ages 75€/group (Up to 15 ppl.)

Guided by the museum's education team, students will explore the **history and evolution of the Olympic Games**, as well as the **development of sport in Catalonia**.

Throughout the visit, they will discover the **wide range of sports practised around the world** through objects, images, texts, audiovisual resources and interactive displays, helping them understand the diversity and richness of sport.

The session concludes with a closer look at the **Barcelona '92 Olympic Games**, exploring their impact and lasting legacy.



## SKILLS AND LEARNING

- Engage with museum resources to gather, interpret and integrate information in a critical and meaningful way.
- Recognise sport as a global cultural expression and its associated values.

# WOULD YOU LIKE TO VISIT THE MUSEUM?

You can **visit the museum independently**, without guidance from the education team. During your visit, you will discover the origins of Olympism, the history of sport in Catalonia, the Barcelona '92 Olympic Games, and the wide range of sports practised around the world.

The museum offers **special rates for school groups**, with the aim of being an accessible space for the educational community.



**Groups from 10 to 15 people - 40€/group**  
*Accompanying adults: free admission*

Access to the museum is organised in groups of 10 to 15 students. The entry will be staggered in smaller groups of 10-15 students every 15 minutes. You can complement your visit with the *Get Ready* activity.

# GET READY

CAT CAST ENG FRA

Ages 6 to 18

*Get Ready* is a *self-guided activity* adapted to different school levels, allowing students to explore the museum while answering a set of questions that introduce them to Olympism, sport practice, the Olympic Games and the Barcelona '92 Games.

**IMPORTANT:** Get Ready must be printed in advance, and each student should bring a pencil or pen.
